SUBJECT MATTER EXPERT

The primary role of a Subject Matter Expert is to review research literature collected regarding specific evidence-based behavioral health strategies.

Qualifications and Education Requirements

- Must have terminal degree in area of expertise
- Must have training in research including coursework as well as empirical products
- Must have expertise in clinical training areas

GRADUATE ASSISTANT

The primary role of a Graduate Assistant is to identify and review research literature regarding specific evidence-based behavioral health strategies.

Qualifications and Education Requirements

- Must be actively enrolled in a graduate program in a relevant field of study
- Must have a faculty reference
- Must have coursework in research
